TRIBE HEADLINES

» Cleveland's current 7.5-game lead in the A.L. Central is the largest divisional lead in MLB and significantly higher than the club's 2.5-game lead entering the second half in 2017...Tribe's 52-43 record entering the club's 96th game of the year is also two wins ahead of 2017's pace (50-45 after 95 games).

» **TREVOR BAUER's** 2.24 ERA ranks 2nd in the A.L. (3rd in MLB), and marks the 5th-lowest first-half ERA by an Indians pitcher since 1969...his 175 strikeouts are the 3rd-most by a pitcher in the first half in franchise history (3rd in A.L., 4th in MLB).

» **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** enters the second half tied for the MLB lead with 29 home runs this season, which is the most ever by a Tribe player in the first half...he is the first Indians batter to hold or share the MLB home run lead at the All-Star break since **AL Rosen** (25 HR) did so in 1950.

STANDINGS CHECK | SECOND HALF STUDS

» The Indians wrapped up their pre-All Star break homestand with a 5-2 win over the New York Yankees, earning a 2-2 series split and finishing the 10-game homestand with a 4-6 record.

» Cleveland remains in first place and maintains a 7.5-game lead in the A.L. Central, the largest divisional lead in the Majors...Tribe has sat atop the Central for each of the last 91 days (back to April 21).

» **Since 2013, the Tribe owns a combined 215-141 (.604) record in the second half, the most wins and best winning percentage in MLB in that span...**the Indians' 3.31 second-half ERA and 1.184 WHIP in that span are also tops in MLB.

TODAY'S TRANSACTION

» On the heels of yesterday's trade, the Indians announced the following moves relative to the active and 40-man rosters.

» Tribe selected the contract of **OF MELKY CABRERA** from AAA Columbus, recalled **OF YANDY DÍAZ** from Columbus and added **LHP BRAD HAND** and **RHP ADAM CIMBER** to the Major League roster...in a corresponding move, Tribe optioned **OF GREG ALLEN**, **RHP ADAM PLUTKO** and **LHP TYLER OLSON** to Columbus & transferred **OF LONNIE CHISENHALL** from the 10-day to the 60-day Disabled List.

» Marks Cabrera's second stint with the Indians this season...batted .207 (12-58) with five doubles and 11 RBI in his first stint from May 20-June 13...rejoined Columbus on July 5 and has hit .361 (13-16) in nine games with the Clippers.

» Díaz has batted .284 (81-285) with 20 doubles, two homers and 27 RBI in 81 Minor League games, all with Columbus...he leads the International League in waks (.63) and on-base percentage (.415).

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS

» The Indians and Rangers will conclude their 2018 season series with three tilts in Arlington this weekend...the two clubs squared off in Cleveland April 30-May 1, with the Tribe winning two of three and outscoring the Rangers 25-17...Tribe posted a 6-1 record vs. Texas in 2017, winning the season series for the first time since 2014.

» Since **Terry Francona** became Tribe manager in 2013, the Indians have posted a 24-12 (.667) record against Texas.

» In 665 all-time matchups, Cleveland holds a 323-342 (.486) record against the Rangers/Senators franchise, including a 217-251 (.464) mark since the team moved to Texas in 1972...Tribe also owns a 50-60 (.455) record at Globe Life Park.

SEEING (ALL) STARS

» The Indians were well-represented in the American League's 8-6 win over the National League in the 2018 MLB All-Star Game on Tuesday night in Washington, D.C...Tribe's six All-Stars were the club's most since 1999 (six)...new acquisition **BRAD HAND** made his second All-Star team, tossing a scoreless inning (1K) for the N.L. side.

» **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** went 0-for-2 and became the first Indians third baseman to start back-to-back All-Star Games since **Al Rosen** in 1953 & 1954...**MICHAEL BRANTLEY** entered the game as a defensive replacement in the 6th, recording a single & an RBI sac fly.

» **YAN GOMES** became the first Brazilian-born All-Star, catching the final five innings of play (0-for-3)...**FRANCISCO LINDOR** went 0-for-1 and played two innings in the field...**COREY KLUBER** and **TREVOR BAUER** did not pitch.

» **Akron (AA): 57-40, 1st (+5.0 G)** » **7/19: W, 12-11 vs. Richmond (walk-off)** » **Today: 7:05 vs. Richmond**
Mark Mathias (1-3) hit a walk-off sacrifice fly...Bobby Bradley (1-5) tied the game on a solo shot in the 9th.

» **Lynchburg (High-A): 45-50 (2nd Half: 16-12)** » **7/19: DH vs. Wilmington** » **Today: 6:30 vs. Wilmington**
The Hillcats fell 3-1 in the first game and took the second game 10-0, led by Gavin Collins's two-run homer.

» **Lake County (A): 42-55 (2nd Half: 13-14)** » **7/19: W, 8-1 vs. Clinton** » **Today: 7:00 vs. Clinton**
Nolan Jones hit a two-run homer...Miguel Eladio went 2-for-4 with a double and tied his career high with three RBI.

» **MV Scrappers (Short-A): 19-12, 1st (+2.5G)** » **7/19: L, 5-7 at Auburn** » **Today: 7:05 at Batavia**
Richard Palacios went 3-for-5 with a double and two RBI, extending his hit streak to 17 games (longest run in NYPL).

BAUER OUTAGE

» Right-hander **TREVOR BAUER** is scheduled to kick off the second half tonight at Texas.

» Faces the Rangers for the second time this season...did not factor into the decision in the Tribe's 7-5 win on April 30 at Progressive Field (6.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 1HR, 3BB, 11K)...owns a career 1-0 mark and 3.48 ERA (13ER/33.2IP) in five starts vs. Texas.

» Has eight starts with 10-or-more strikeouts this season, which is the 3rd-most such outings in MLB, behind Washington's **Max Scherzer** (10) and Boston's **Chris Sale** (9).

» **Bauer's 175 strikeouts this year rank 3rd in the American League (4th in MLB) and the 3rd-most by an Indians pitcher in the first half of the season, behind Bob Feller (190 in 1946) and Sam McDowell (183 in 1970)...**Bauer's first half total marks the most by a Tribe hurler since **McDowell's** 1970 total.

» Has posted strong numbers on the road this season, with a 4-5 record and 2.26 ERA (17ER/67.2IP) in 10 starts...his road ERA is the 4th-lowest in the A.L. and 7th-lowest in MLB.

WELCOME TO THE BULLPEN

» Yesterday, the Indians acquired **LHP BRAD HAND** and **RHP ADAM CIMBER** from the San Diego Padres in exchange for **C/ OF FRANCISCO MEJÍA**...both pitchers will join the club today and be available out of the bullpen, as part of the day's transactions.

» Hand, 28, has recorded 24 saves (T3rd in N.L.) in 41 relief appearances for San Diego and ranks 4th among N.L. relievers with 65 strikeouts...**he is also one of just five relievers in MLB with 20-or-more saves and 0 inherited runners scored, alongside ARI's Brad Boxberger, NYY's Aroldis Chapman, SEA's Edwin Díaz and LAD's Kenley Jansen...**Hand owns a 2.66 ERA (6.3ER/213.0IP) since the start of 2016 and his 280 strikeouts in that span are 2nd-most in MLB (NYY's **Dellin Betances** - 298).

» Cimber, 27, has compiled a 3-5 record and 3.17 ERA (17ER/48.1IP) in 42 relief outings for the Padres this season after making his MLB debut on March 29...**has limited right-handed batters to a .210 batting average against...**Cimber has allowed jus two earned runs in July, good for a 2.16 ERA (2ER/8.1IP).

SCORE TACTICS

» Cleveland enters tonight ranked 3rd in MLB with 132 home runs (New York-AL - 161, Boston - 134)...132 homers is tied with the 2000 club for the most first-half longballs in franchise history.

» The Tribe's 329 extra-base hits mark the club's most-ever in the first half and rank 3rd in MLB...the club also ranks 5th in the A.L. with a .255 team batting average and .326 on-base percentage.

» Additionally, the Indians are the only team in MLB with five players having 50-or-more RBI (**RAMÍREZ - 70, ENCARNACION - 65, LINDOR - 62, BRANTLEY - 56, ALONSO - 53**)...Tribe are also one of two teams (also Cincinnati) with three batters with 60-or-more RBI...marks the first time the Tribe achieved both feats since 1999 (**Roberto Alomar, David Justice, Manny Ramírez, Richie Sexson and Jim Thome**).

» **The Indians lead Major League Baseball with 93 runs scored in July (6.6 per game)...**they also led MLB in May (179 runs).

JOSÉ FOR EFFORT

» **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** enters tonight's game tied for the Major League lead with a career-high tying 29 home runs (also 2017)...his 29 homers are tied with **Mickey Mantle** (1956 & 1961) and **Lance Berkman** (2002) for the most first-half homers in MLB history by a switch hitter at the All-Star break.

» **Stole a base in his last game before the break, becoming the fifth player in Major League history with at least 25 home runs and 20 stolen bases at the All-Star break,** joining **Bobby Bonds** (1973), **Eric Davis** (1987), **Alex Rodriguez** (1998) and **Alfonso Soriano** (2006)...also marked the second Indians hitter with at least 20HR/20SB before the break, after **Grady Sizemore** in 2008.

» Ramírez continues to lead MLB with 57 extra-base hits, which is tied with **Albert Belle** (1995) and **Jim Thome** (1998) for the 4th-most extra-base hits by an Indians hitter through 95 team games in the *Baseball-Reference* Play Index era (1908-).

» Ramírez is batting .357 (20-56) in 14 July games, and his 12 extra-base hits this month lead the Majors, while his 17 RBI are T2nd and his five home runs rank T3rd.

THIS DAY IN INDIANS HISTORY

2012: Cody Allen makes his Major League debut, tossing an inning in the Tribe's 10-2 loss to Baltimore at Progressive Field...he entered the game with one on and none out in the top of the 4th inning, and walked the first two batters he faced before retiring the side, fanning Mark Reynolds for his first career strikeout...Allen became the all-time franchise saves leader earlier this year and his 142 saves since 2012 are 2nd among A.L. pitchers in that span.

TONIGHT’S START

» The 27-year-old right-hander is due to make his 21st start of the season in tonight’s second-half opener against the Texas Rangers in Arlington...will mark his 153rd ca-reer appearance and 144th start.

» Will be pitching on regular four days’ rest after starting the Indians’ final game of the first half on July 15 vs. New York-AL....did not factor into the decision as Cleveland rallied late to defeat the Yankees 5-2...tossed 7.0 innings, allowing two runs on seven hits (one home run) with one walk and seven strikeouts.

» Bauer is due to face the Rangers for the second time this season, after starting against them on April 30 at Progressive Field...did not factor into the decision in the Tribe’s 7-5 win, recording a quality start (6.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 1HR, 3BB)....also fanned 11 batters, marking his first outing of the season with 10-or-more strikeouts.

» **Was named to his first career All-Star team, representing the Indians on the American League squad on Tuesday night in Washington, D.C....**did not pitch in the A.L.’s 8-6 win over the National League.

» Has made quality starts in 16 of his 20 starts, the 2nd-most on the club (**COREY KLUBER** - 17) and tied for 4th-most in MLB.

» Entering tonight’s game, ranks among the American League pitching leaders in ERA (2.24, 2nd), innings pitched (136.1, 2nd), opponent slugging percentage (.304, 2nd), game started (20, T2nd), strikeouts (175, 3rd), night ERA (2.01, 3rd), road ERA (2.26, 4th), strikeouts-per-9.0IP (11.6, 5th) and opponent batting average (.208, 6th).

VS. TEXAS | A.L. WEST

» Bauer is due to face the Rangers for the second time this season...did not factor into the decision in the Tribe’s 7-5 win on April 30 at Progressive Field, tossing 6.2 innings and striking out 11 batters (4H, 2R/ER, 1HR, 3BB).

» Has compiled a 1-0 record and 3.48 ERA (13ER/33.2IP) in five career starts vs. Texas...earned his lone decision, a win, against the Rangers on June 28, 2017 at Pro-gressive Field (6.1IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 1HR, 1BB, 3K).

» Tonight will mark Bauer’s fifth start of the season vs. an opponent from the A.L. West... has posted a 0-1 record and 3.51 ERA in his four prior starts.

» In 32 career appearances (31 starts) vs. the A.L. West, has compiled a 14-7 record and 3.60 ERA (79ER/197.1IP)...his 3.48 ERA vs. Texas is his 3rd-lowest against an op-ponent from this division (Los Angeles-AL - 2.70, Houston - 3.18).

A HALF TO REMEMBER

» Bauer has had a dominant start to the season, etching his name into the Indians record books in the first half.

» **He posted a 2.24 ERA in the first half, which marks the 5th-lowest first-half ERA by an Indians pitcher since 1969...**enters tonight 2nd in the American League in ERA.

» Recorded 175 strikeouts in the first half, which is the 3rd-most by an Indians pitcher in the first half of the season, behind **Bob Feller** (190 in 1946) and **Sam McDowell** (183 in 1970)...also enters tonight 3rd in the A.L. (4th in MLB) in strikeouts.

» Bauer is also averaging 11.55 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP so far this season, which is the 2nd-highest rate by an Indians pitcher in the first half of the campaign (min. 80.0IP), behind **COREY KLUBER** (11.86 in 2017).

ROAD WARRIOR

» Tonight marks Bauer’s 11th road outing of the season...enters tonight with a 4-5 record and 2.39 ERA (18ER/67.2IP) in his prior road starts...**his 2.26 road ERA ranks 4th in the A.L. and 7th in MLB entering play tonight.**

» Earned the win in his last road start on July 4 at Kansas City, allowing two runs on seven hits over 7.2 innings, with one walk and eight strikeouts.

» He has also allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in each of his last 15 road starts, dat-ing back to August 14, 2017...marks the longest such streak of his career and is 8-5 with a 2.16 ERA (24ER/100.0IP) in that span...streak also marks the longest by an Indians pitcher since **COREY KLUBER** had an 18-start run from April 13, 2014 - April 17, 2015.

» Bauer owns a career record of 24-26 with a 3.90 ERA (166ER/383.0IP) in 71 road ap-pearances (66 starts).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS | 2018 RECAP

» **From June 8 - July 10, Bauer recorded a streak of seven consecutive quality start with eight-or-more strikeouts and not home runs allowed, which repre-sented the 2nd-longest such streak in the live ball era (1920-), behind Pedro Martinez’s run of eight starts from July 1 - August 10, 2002 (STATS LLC).**

» Bauer also struck out eight-or-more batters in nine consecutive starts from May 27-July 10, a career-long run for Bauer and the longest such run by an Indians pitcher since **COREY KLUBER’s** 14-start streak from June 1-Aug. 1, 2017.

» Bauer finished the month of June with a 2.18 ERA (10ER/41.1IP), marking his 3rd-lowest ERA in a single month in his career (min. 4GS), behind March/April 2015 (1.80 ERA) and June 2016 (2.01 ERA)...**he also led MLB with 62 strikeouts in June.**

» **He has struck out 10-or-more batters in a eight starts this season, which is the 3rd-most such starts in MLB, behind Washington’s Max Scherzer (10) and Boston’s Chris Sale (9).**

» Bauer has thrown 100-or-more pitches in each of his 20 starts so far this season, which is the longest such streak of his career and the longest active run in MLB... streak is also the longest streak of consecutive starts with 100-plus pitches by an In-dians pitcher since 1988, the most recent year that *Baseball Reference* has accurate pitch count data available...streak marks the longest such run in MLB since Tampa Bay’s **Chris Archer** had a 24-game run from August 12, 2016 - June 16, 2017.

» Recorded a streak of 10-or-more strikeouts in four consecutive starts from May 27 to July 13...streak the longest such run in MLB this season...**marked just the third pitcher in Indians franchise history to record a streak of four-or-more starts with 10-or-more strikeouts.** joining teammate **COREY KLUBER** (two streaks of five starts in 2017) and Hall-of-Famer **Bob Feller** (one streak of four starts from 1938-39).

CAREER SNAPSHOT

» Right-hander is in his sixth season with the Indians organization after being acquired from the Arizona Diamondbacks on December 11, 2012, along with RHP Matt Albers, RHP Bryan Shaw (from Arizona) & Drew Stubbs (from Cincinnati), in a 3-team trade... at time of trade, was ranked as Arizona’s No. 1 prospect by *Baseball America* and had just earned Dbacks Minor League Pitcher of the Year honors.

» Made his Major League debut with Arizona on June 28, 2012, becoming the first player from the 2011 Draft Class to reach the Majors...did not factor into the decision after allowing two runs on five hits in 4.0 innings of work.

» **In 2017, recorded his best Major League season to date in the Tribe rotation, posting career-highs in wins (17), strikeouts (196) and innings pitched (176.1), while recording his lowest full-season ERA (4.19).**

» The 2018 season marks his eighth overall in professional baseball after being selected by Arizona in the first round of the 2011 draft out of UCLA, where he went 38-4 with a 2.36 ERA across three seasons for the Bruins...finished his college career holding a number of school records, including a Pac-10 record with 203 strikeouts in 2011.

» The Southern California native graduated from Hart High School in Santa Clarita, the same HS that produced Kevin Millar, James Shields, Bob Walk and Todd Zeile.
